This half term as part of our curriculum enrichment, we got to meet the Olympian, Danusia Francis, who discussed the reasons behind representing the Jamaican National Team after her stint in the British National team. This was because after being at university in LA, she found a more direct route to represent a country due to her heritage (Polish, Jamaican, born in England).

Danusia's favourite event is the beam and she is an amazing performer. She showed the children her ariel cartwheel (no handed cartwheel). She has retired from gymnastics and is 29 years old. She enjoys baking in her spare time and she lives with her husband and ginger cat in Kent.

The children got to opportunity to discuss the problems that professional sports people encounter such as injury and politics and a rigorous training programme. The children were all also lucky enough to participate in a PE lesson lead by Danusia. Make sure you ask them to show you their skills of what they learnt.

We may see her very shortly presenting the gymnastics on television. She is currently a stunt artist (was a stunt double for Wonder Woman) and a gymnastics commentator. We have also been carrying out scientific investigations for our topic 'Sound'. We used decibel meters to find the answer to the question 'where is the quietest place in school?'.



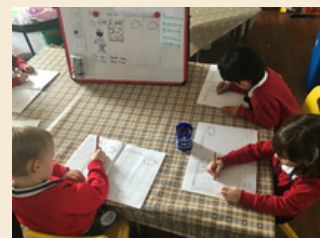
MERCURY

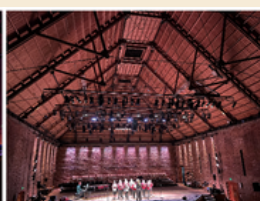
ASTRONAUTS

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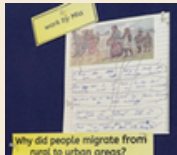
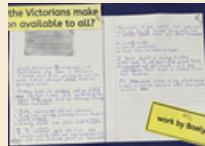

Oak Class have been learning and experimenting in DT, with batteries, wires and light bulbs, to see if they could get the bulbs to light up. They have been learning about how to make a circuit and the different symbols that are used when they draw a circuit.

World Book Day was a great success, with Oak Class sharing their books they brought in. We enjoyed sharing 'The Cow that Laid an Egg' as a whole school and wrote character descriptions and newspaper articles.
