

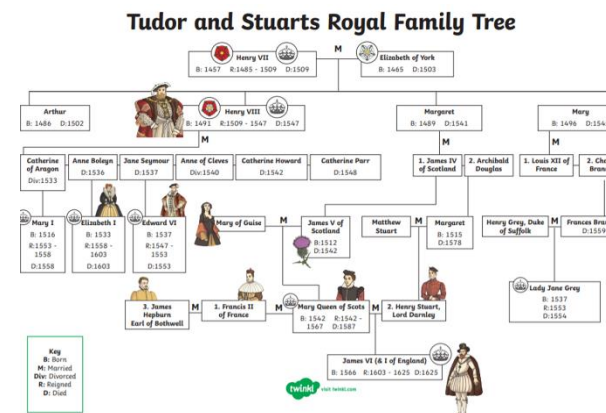

1603- the start of the Stuart period	
1603	Elizabeth I dies and James VI of Scotland crowned James I of England uniting the two kingdoms.
1649- No monarch (King or Queen) England became a Republic for eleven years from 1649 - 1660	
1660	<u>The monarchy in Britain was restored.</u> King Charles of Scotland became King Charles II of England.
1664-1665	29 May - The Great Plague of London killed more than 100,000 people died. By the time the epidemic finished in December 1665, a quarter of the capital's inhabitants had perished. 
1666	Great Fire of London raged from 2 - 5 September destroying two-thirds of the city 
1672	The Battle of Sole Bay, Southwold. England and France joined forces against the Dutch Republic. England and France was led by James, Duke of York & Albany (Future King James II), Edward, Duke of Sandwich and Jean II, Marshall of France. The battle ended inconclusively, with both sides claiming victory. 

1714	August- Queen Anne dies at Kensington Palace in London at the age of 49 and is known as the last monarch of the Stuart period.
1714- the start of Georgian Britain	
1714	George of Hanover is proclaimed King George I of Great Britain and Ireland after the death of Queen Anne.
1796	Edward Jenner invents a vaccination against small pox
1812	Charles Dickens born.
1714- the start of Victorian Britain	
1837	King William IV dies and is succeeded by his niece, Princess Victoria of Kent. The princess became Queen Victoria at the age of 18.
1838	February- Charles Dickens' 'Oliver Twist' book is published. 
1901	Queen Victoria dies at the age of 81 at Osborne House, Isle of Wight. Known as the Victorian era, her reign of 63 years and 7 months was at that point, the longest reigning monarch of the modern time. During her reign there was a period of industrial, political, scientific, and military change within the United Kingdom, and was marked by a great expansion of the British Empire.
1901	Queen Victoria's son, Edward, Prince of Wales, became King Edward VII of the United Kingdom as well as Emperor of India, ending the Victorian era.
